RE: FORENSIC INVESTIGATIONS AT KENYA AIRWAYS LIMITED

We refer to your letter dated 18th April 2017 and ours dated 21st June 2016.

Subsequent to our letter of 21st June 2016, your client was given sufficient opportunity to respond to certain aspects relating to the investigations. The particulars are within your client's knowledge and these include your client's written responses dated; 27th April 2016, 15th August 2016 and 9th September 2016 to various questions asked by our forensic investigation team. Our team met with your client on 14th March 2016 and on 16th June 2016.

Neither our Jack Njuguna nor any other person from our forensic investigation team has released information concerning your client to the Director of Public Prosecutions ("ODPP").

In the event that the ODPP or any other relevant government agency seeks information from our client regarding your client arising from the investigations, this will be done with concurrence from our instructing client, Kenya Airways Ltd ("KQ") and within the confines of the law.

We are not able to release the forensic reports. Our mandate is owed to KQ who have not allowed us to release the report to other third parties. We would be breaching the duty owed to KQ if we are to release the reports. Your reliance on Article 35 of the Constitution for release the reports cannot therefore stand.

In view of the foregoing, we deny all the allegations made in your letter. We do not admit any liability whatsoever and any misconceived legal proceedings filed against us will be suitably defended.
